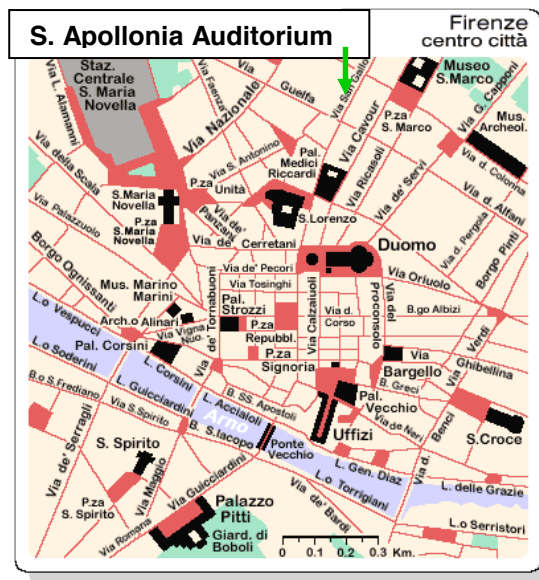

Recognize the relevance of the pattern of invasion in the clinical behavior of cervical adenocarcinoma.
Use p16 immunostain to provide an accurate diagnosis in a selected group of cervical and vulvar lesions.
Understand the histological features seen in problematic mesenchymal tumors of the uterus, including the presence of vascular involvement.
Identify relevant clinicopathologic features of primary mucinous neoplasms of the ovary
Distinguish metastatic from primary carcinomas in the ovary.
Develop an algorithm to handle serous neoplasms in the ovary, including BRCA+ cases.
Recognize the clinicopathologic features of a group of lesions arising in the female peritoneum and identify potential pitfalls in the assessment of these lesions.
Analyze properly the precursors of endometrial cancer.
Approach effectively difficult cases of endometrial cancer.
Understand the role of the pathologist in the diagnosis of Lynch syndrome-associated endometrial carcinoma.
