

Symposium Description

The symposium provides a multidisciplinary overview of the diagnosis and treatment of all stages of breast cancer. Faculty includes experts in the fields of surgical, medical and radiation oncology, pathology, radiology, surgery, psychology, reconstructive surgery and patient advocacy. The target audience includes clinicians, specialists, health care providers and scientists involved in the care and treatment of patients with breast cancer, as well as research and education concerning this important disease.

Objectives

Upon completion of this course, participants should be able to:

- **Familiarize** the audience with the current state of the art breast imaging technologies for better breast cancer detection
- Clarify which modality is more likely to find invasive and noninvasive tumors
- Review the indications for imaging the axilla in the preoperative setting in the Z11 era
- Review key points in imaging the axilla in patients undergoing neoadjuvant chemotherapy
- **Understand c**ontemporary theories of cancer as it relates to carcinogenesis, prognosis, therapy and prevention
- **Inform** the participant of available data regarding risk factors and selection of patients for omission of radiation after lumpectomy and discuss ongoing trials addressing this issue
- **Understand** the rationale for pre-operative systemic therapy for breast cancer and to formulate individualized treatment and monitoring plans
- Incorporate biological and clinical trial evidence in the optimal use of endocrine therapy for breast cancer
- Review current data for accelerated partial breast irradiation and describe new and emerging techniques
- Review the recent clinical data for immune therapy in breast cancer and describe future directions
- Review an alternative approach of breast reconstruction using tissue expander or implant
- **Review** the available approaches and treatments in managing post operative pain in patients having mastectomy surgery
- **Familiarize** the audience with the range and safety of fertility preservation techniques and technologies available to breast cancer patients and survivors
- **Familiarize** the audience manifestations of menopause in breast cancer survivors as well as the efficacy and safety of various interventions, including hormones, hormonal analogues and manipulators and alternative therapies.
- Understand the indications for the outcomes of re-irradiation for in-breast recurrence
